### **Turn 1: Early October 2024**

Israel launches its invasion of southern Lebanon, aiming to crush Hezbollah. Iran reacts swiftly and aggressively, sending additional forces to directly support Hezbollah, including advanced missile systems. Iran also escalates with missile strikes on Israeli airbases, causing significant damage. Hezbollah mounts a strong initial defense, using Iranian-supplied weapons to hold off Israel's advance. Hamas remains mostly dormant but tests Israel's defenses with a few rocket launches. The USA calls for restraint, but its influence is limited as both Israel and Iran show no interest in backing down, setting the stage for a brutal conflict.

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### **Turn 2: Late October 2024**

Iran continues its aggressive stance, sending more troops and weapons into Lebanon. Iranian missile strikes target Israeli infrastructure, causing power outages and damage to military installations. Israel responds with massive airstrikes on Iranian positions in Syria and Lebanon, inflicting heavy casualties but not halting the Iranian advances. Hezbollah capitalizes on Iran's support, launching effective counter-attacks that slow the Israeli advance. Hamas, emboldened by Iran's aggressiveness, intensifies rocket attacks on Israel, causing minor damage. The USA ramps up diplomatic efforts, but the conflict escalates as both sides refuse to yield.

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### **Turn 3: Early November 2024**

Israel's forces struggle to make significant progress in Lebanon as Hezbollah, reinforced by Iranian advisors and elite units, holds strong defensive positions. Iran escalates further by deploying ballistic missiles aimed at Israeli cities, though many are intercepted by Israel's missile defense systems. Israel retaliates with cyberattacks on Iran's military infrastructure, disrupting communication and logistics. Hamas launches its largest rocket offensive yet, but the Iron Dome remains effective. The USA begins

coordinating with its allies in the region, but with little progress on diplomatic efforts, the war deepens.

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#### **Turn 4: Late November 2024**

Israel regroups and intensifies its offensive in Lebanon, pushing Hezbollah forces back, but at a high cost in casualties. Iran responds by escalating the conflict further, deploying more advanced missiles and drones to support Hezbollah, causing severe damage to Israeli military targets. Hezbollah's guerrilla tactics, combined with Iranian support, continue to inflict heavy losses on Israeli troops. Hamas attempts to coordinate with Hezbollah, launching a series of attacks on southern Israel, but remains a secondary threat. The USA pushes for a ceasefire, but both Israel and Iran are too entrenched in their objectives to consider de-escalation.

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#### **Turn 5: Early December 2024**

Israel struggles to maintain its momentum in Lebanon as Hezbollah, heavily backed by Iran, mounts a fierce defense. Iran's missile and drone strikes on Israel continue, causing more destruction and pressuring Israel's defenses. Israeli airstrikes on Iranian positions in Syria and Lebanon intensify, but Iran's aggressive strategy keeps Hezbollah in the fight. Hamas attempts to regain influence in Gaza by orchestrating mass protests, gaining some regional attention, but its military capabilities remain limited. The USA continues diplomatic pressure, but Iran's uncompromising stance and Israel's determination to neutralize Hezbollah prolong the conflict.

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#### **Turn 6: Late December 2024**

Israel makes limited territorial gains in Lebanon, but Hezbollah remains a potent force, sustained by Iran's unrelenting support. Iran's aggressive missile campaigns continue, severely impacting Israeli infrastructure and morale. Despite high casualties, Israel manages to hold northern settlements and prevent Hezbollah from advancing, but the conflict has drained Israel's resources. Hamas remains largely ineffective, though it continues to attempt rocket strikes. The USA manages to broker a fragile ceasefire, though neither side is satisfied with the outcome. Both Israel and Iran remain locked in a cold war-like state, with no clear resolution in sight.

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#### **End of Game Summary:**

By the end of December 2024, Israel has made some gains in Lebanon but at a tremendous cost in casualties and resources. Hezbollah, supported aggressively by Iran, remains a formidable threat, holding territory in northern Lebanon and continuing its guerrilla attacks. Iran's aggressive strategy, including direct military involvement and missile strikes on Israel, has escalated the conflict beyond expectations, though it failed to deliver a decisive victory. Israel's air and cyber counterattacks inflicted damage on Iranian and Hezbollah forces but couldn't completely neutralize the threats. Hamas remains on the sidelines, unable to significantly influence the larger conflict. The USA managed to broker a ceasefire, but it is tenuous at best, with both Israel and Iran poised to resume hostilities in the near future. The war has left the region even more volatile, with neither Israel nor Iran achieving their primary objectives fully.
